

I was inspired to write "As a Woman" after having participated in a 1983encirclement of the Boeing Cruise Missile Plant in Kent, WA which was sponsored by the Puget Sound Women's Peace Camp. I saw this quote on a placard being carried by one of the other participants. The quote is from Virginia Woolf's long essay, "Three Guineas" (1936-37) on her views about war and women, and how to prevent war. The three part quote suggested the form of the piece; as each line is sung three times.

The English writer, Virginia Woolf (1882-1941) is widely considered to be a major 20th century novelist and one of the foremost modernist writers of her day. She was an innovator and her novels were very experimental. *Three Guineas*, the text source for *As a Woman* is an essay Woolf penned in 1937. It is structured as a response to a gentleman's letter asking her to join his efforts to prevent the looming war.
