Joan Szymko (b.1957) is a composer and conductor from the Pacific Northwest. With a catalog of over 100 published choral works, her music is regularly performed across North America and abroad including performances at national and international choral festivals and competitions. The ACDA recognized Szymko's lasting impact on the choral arts in America by selecting her as a recipient of the prestigious Raymond W. Brock Memorial Commission in 2010.

Malala Yousafzai (b.1997) survived three gunshot wounds to the head at the hands of the Taliban in 2012. She was targeted because she was an activist for the rights of girls to be educated. After the attack young people around the world stood up in solidarity saying, "I am Malala." Since her miraculous recovery, she has become a global advocate for children's education and in 2014 became the youngest ever Nobel Prize laureate.
