#### **JOAN SZYMKO**

is widely regarded as a foremost composer of choral music in America today. She has been stirring up the pool of repertoire for women's chorus for over thirty years as

both a composer and conductor. Her music has been performed at every National Conference of the American Choral Directors Association since 2003. The ACDA recognized Szymko's lasting impact on the choral arts in America by selecting her as the recipient of the Raymond W. Brock Memorial Commission in 2010. Szymko directs Aurora Chorus, (Portland, Ore) has served on the choral music faculty at Portland State University and as a visiting artist, has workshopped her music with choirs in a variety of settings across the US and in the Netherlands. #### NOTES from the COMPOSER

The opening chords and exuberant opening unison suggests the "big bang"— the singular explosion theorized by astronomers as the origin of our expanding universe. (black note clusters at M.1-6 and at M.64-69 are to be played with forearm and side of hand). The piano ostinato that follows beginning at M.7 consists of a 5-note 16th-note pattern over a steady quarter-note 5/4 pulse, lending an unstable, fluctuating quality to the the lyrics: "Earth changes..." As the underlying rhythm in the accompaniment settles, the lyrical quality of the setting takes hold, building toward a galvanizing, uplifting expression of "belonging."

This is the third prose poem by Alla Bozarth that I have set. I am drawn to Ms. Bozarth's imagery and to her universal expressions of spirituality.

#### ALLA RENÉE BOZARTH

Alla is a Russian, Celtic, Osage American poet, Episcopal priest, Ph.D. in performing arts and Gestalt psychotherapist soul caregiver who lives at the foot of Mt. Hood in Western Oregon. She has published 20 prose and poetry books and 4 audio albums with 14 more large poetry collections, 7 small books and 2 CDs ready for publication. Alla has written award winning poetry for over forty years. Her poems are widely used all over the world, often in collaboration with visual artists, singers and dancers.

#### Belonging

The small plot of ground on which you were born cannot be expected to stay forever the same. Earth changes, and home becomes different places. You took flesh from clay but the clay did not come from just one place. To feel alive, important, and safe, know your own waters and hills, but know more.
